Civitan Foundation began supporting SO in 1979 with money and volunteers and in 1983 were the prime sponsor for the

games in Baton Rouge. The second speaker was Ronald LaJaunie (second from left in picture) who was a past member of Civitan but is now the District Director for SO in Lafourche Parish. Both gentlemen drove in from Houma to share with us their love and devotion for the Special Olympics movement.

The **Tootsie Roll Drive** this year was another tremendous success thanks in large part to Richard Holder, his assistants Jim Hubbs, Rene' Theriot and Paul Duplessis plus the more than 30 Council volunteers who who stood out in front of six local retail stores collecting donations. The Council approved distributing the



2010 proceeds to St. Mary's Residential Training Facility (\$415) in Alexandria, McMain's Children's Development Center (\$1,854) in Baton Rouge and Career Opportunity of East Ascension (\$1,854) in Gonzales. The checks were presented on

These organizations are always very appreciative of the donations and asked that we extend their thanks to the entire St. John The Evangelist Knights of Columbus Council.

The Council participated in the **St. John Christmas Tree Stars and Angels** program again this year. We contributed five 20-24" bicycles for the children of families in need in our parish. It is really a site to see the Community Center floor covered with gifts donated through the generosity of our parishioners.

The Council kick-off activity was to help with the SO Area Bowling Tournament that was held on December 3,4 and 10 at All Star Lanes in Baton Rouge. Over the 3 days of the event, almost 500 special needs individuals from area grade schools, junior and senior high schools as well as adults participated in the tournament. It was amazing to see how excited they would get even if they only hit one pin. Most of the special needs adults bowl in a mixed league and



one young man rolled a 200 in the tournament. We were mostly just cheerleaders but you could tell that the children as well as the adults really enjoyed the high 5's. It's very easy to get caught up in the enthusiasm of these very special people. The SO State Bowling Tournament is being held in Baton Rouge in April and we hope to be able to increase the number of volunteers from our Council. Charlie Courville, the State SO coordinator, will be joining us at the January business meeting to tell us more about Louisiana Special Olympics.

## Our Financial Health

Our income in **December** was \$250 and expenses totaled \$1,581. The expenses included 17 Staff Appreciation \$25 Gift Cards (\$425), 5 Christmas Stars and Angels bikes (\$390) and food for the LSU Christ The King lunch (\$690). All of the expense items were within budget. With six months completed (50 % of the fraternal year), our total income has been \$21,747 (59 % of budget) and the total expenses has been \$20,122 (55 % of budget) for a net gain to-date of \$1,623. Congratulations to Corey Orgeron for winning \$62 at the December business meeting **50/50 drawing!**



The **2011 Charity Calendar** returns are beginning to come in. We distributed 1,950 of the 2,000 calendars printed and we have received proceeds back from 3 of the 8 Council's and 1 Assembly that participate in the program. We have still not received payment from all of the 14 calendar sponsors but will be following up with them over the next month. Certificates of Appreciation were prepared and delivered to Mindy Coogan (Mindy with Brother Delphin at left) and Thelma Varmall for the large number of calendars that they sell each year. The drawing for the January 2011 calendar will take place on February 2nd so we still have a full month to go. We do ask that you return your calendar sales cash and checks before the 2nd to help us get a head start on "stuffing" the medicine bottles with stubs.

## Getting to Know your Officers and Committee Chairmen

### *Associate Pastor - Rev. Nutan Sylvester Minj*



**Fr. Sylvester** was born in the village of Konpala Bera Toli which is located in the district and diocese of Simdega in the state of Jharkhand, India. I know the most of us have no idea where these places are located so suffice it to say that his home is in central India. Fr. Sylvester is multi-lingual speaking three languages: Hindi, English and Sadri. His father was a farmer growing primarily grain crops. He is the middle child of seven brothers and two sisters. He says that his mother and father are very proud of the fact that all nine children are educated. His youngest brother is currently studying to become a Jesuit priest. Fr. Sylvester attended St. Anthony Middle school and St. Pius X High school in his home district/state. He left home after high school to attend Minor Seminary at Kerala in the South of India.

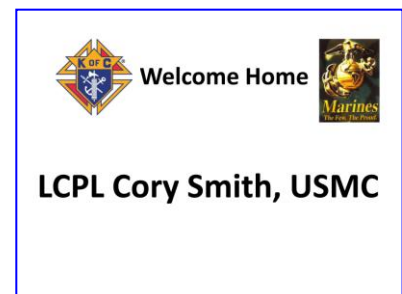
Afterwards, he completed his BA degree in Philosophy and Theology. Thirteen years later on May 3, 1997, he was ordained a priest in the Indian Missionary Society (IMS Congregation). His first assignment was as Associate Pastor in St. Thomas parish in the Archdiocese of Delhi. Two years later, he was assigned Associate Pastor, and later Pastor, of St. Cecilia's Church in Delhi. At this point, Fr. Sylvester had a change of pace and became the Assistant Rector and later the Rector of the IMS Minor Seminary in Meerut, Utter Pradesh. After this experience, he went back to school and earned a MA degree in Spirituality and Counseling at Dharmaram College in Bangalore. Upon receiving his advanced degree, he was assigned to the staff at the Vishwa Jyoti Gurukul Major Seminary as a teacher and a counselor to seminarians. He served in this role for 4 years until a request arrived from Bishop Muench asking for IMS priests to come to the US to serve in the diocese of Baton Rouge. Fortunately, Fr. Sylvester was assigned to St. John the Evangelist to help Fr. Eric with the heavy workload in our growing parish. We are doing our best to "Americanize" Fr. Sylvester in his first few month in south Louisiana (note in the picture that he wearing a Saints jacket). In one of the first KC events after Fr. Sylvester's arrival in the parish, he showed up at the gym and began helping us set-up tables. We knew immediately that he was Knight of Columbus material! Fr. Sylvester made his First Degree at the St. Theresa KC Hall on November 4th and his presence at almost all our events since is greatly appreciated. When I asked Fr. Sylvester to share something personal about himself he responded that he really enjoys vegetable and flower gardening. He said that he has had large gardens in the past and some day hopes to get back to working the soil. He also enjoys reading, especially about psychology, and said he would like to travel around the US before he has to depart. We hope that Fr. Sylvester has many years here in the US to accomplish this goal.

### *Soldier Welcoming Home*



The Council was at the Baton Rouge airport early on Christmas Eve to welcome home Marine Lance Corporal Cory Smith from Afghanistan. He is on leave over the Christmas Holidays after serving since May in a USMC combat platoon. It was a tearful homecoming with

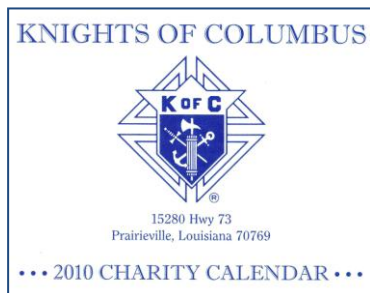
